How it Matters to Kansans

Today Kansas is among the states with the **most restrictive Medicaid eligibility rules.**

KanCare Today

The only Kansans who are eligible for coverage today are:

Expanded KanCare

Expanding KanCare would make coverage available to **150,000 additional Kansans** by updating the eligibility rules that exclude them today.

Children 0-18 in households earning \$60,992 or less for a family of four



All children eligible today remain eligible

Pregnant women making \$20,759 or less



All pregnant women eligible today remain eligible

Elderly or disabled Kansans making \$8,862 or less



Elderly or disabled Kansans making up to \$16,753

Parents making \$9,538 or less for a family of four



Parents making up to \$34,638 for a family of four

No non-disabled adults without children



Non-disabled adults without children earning up to \$16,753

The 150,000 Kansans who would become eligible under expanded KanCare earn too much to qualify for KanCare today, but not enough to qualify for support to buy private insurance.
